

HISTORIC OLD HOMES  
Trimble County

1. The Preston Home was originally known as the Old Norfold Plantation before it was purchased by John and Mary Preston and owned for the past twenty nine years by Mr. J. D. Rodgers.

It is located five miles from Milton on Pecks Pike.

This home is quite outstanding and has a great deal of history connected with it, which has been given in a previous copy.

2. The Cedars - Bedford, Kentucky.

About one hundred years ago the old home called The Cedars was known as Epsom Springs and was a popular resort hotel of the south. The grounds were quite beautiful, with winding walks and flower gardens.

In 1850 the place was closed as a resort and later purchased by James F. Young and converted into a private residence.

The home is still in possession of the Young family who are lineal descendants of Aquilla Whitaker, The Indian fighter. Tenants are now living in the home. This home is one of the oldest in Trimble county.

3. The Parker Home and Springs.

The Bedford Springs located one-half mile south of Bedford, Kentucky, just off of Highway No. 42.

This place was once the scene of elaborate balls and festivities. In 1848 it was at the height of it's glory. This place was quite famous and the old hotel is now being used as a private residence.

4. The Old Collis Home, is located about five miles south of Bedford, Kentucky on Road No. 42. It is now known as Kentucky Tavern. There are quite a number of old homes in Trimble county, such as the Old Steely Home

on Road No. 37 and the old Ross Home on old Bedford and Milton pike, but the Historical one's and most outstanding are the Preston Home, Parker's Home and old Young home.
