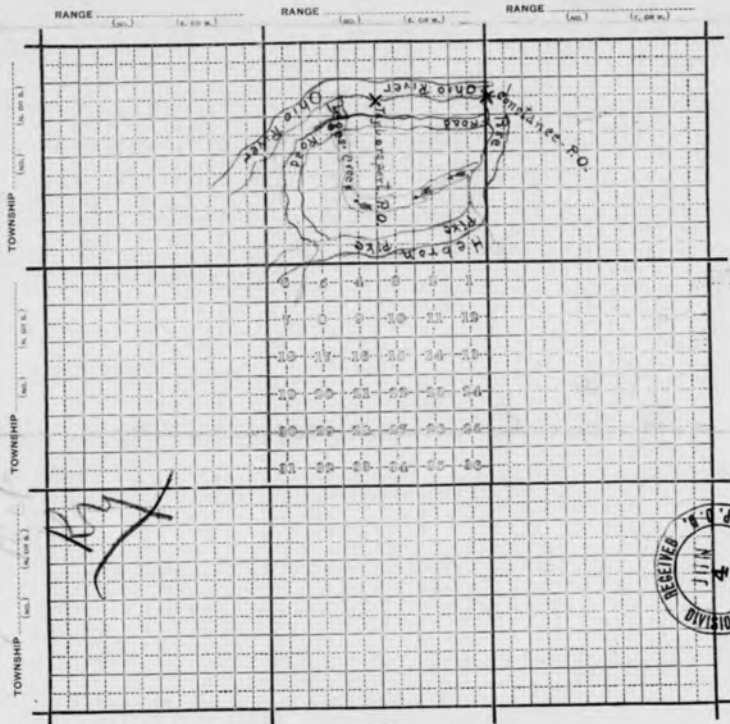

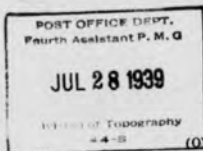

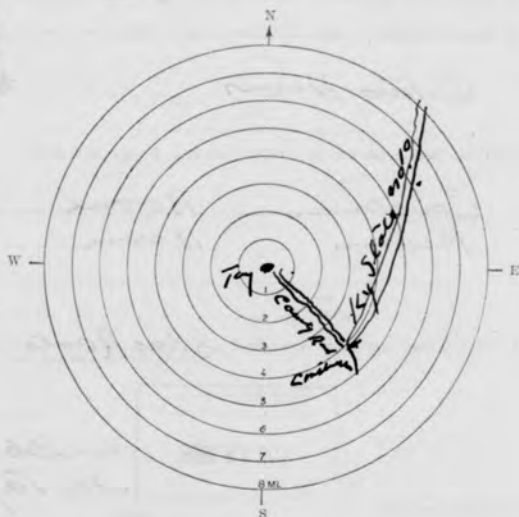
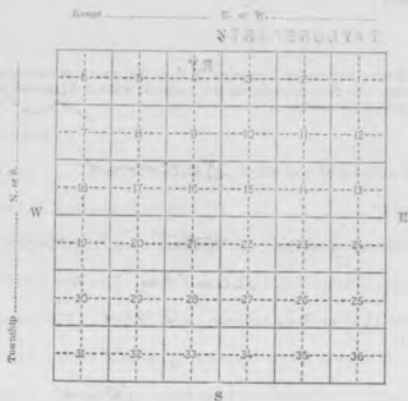
- a. Adjacent post offices (show with small dots and name).

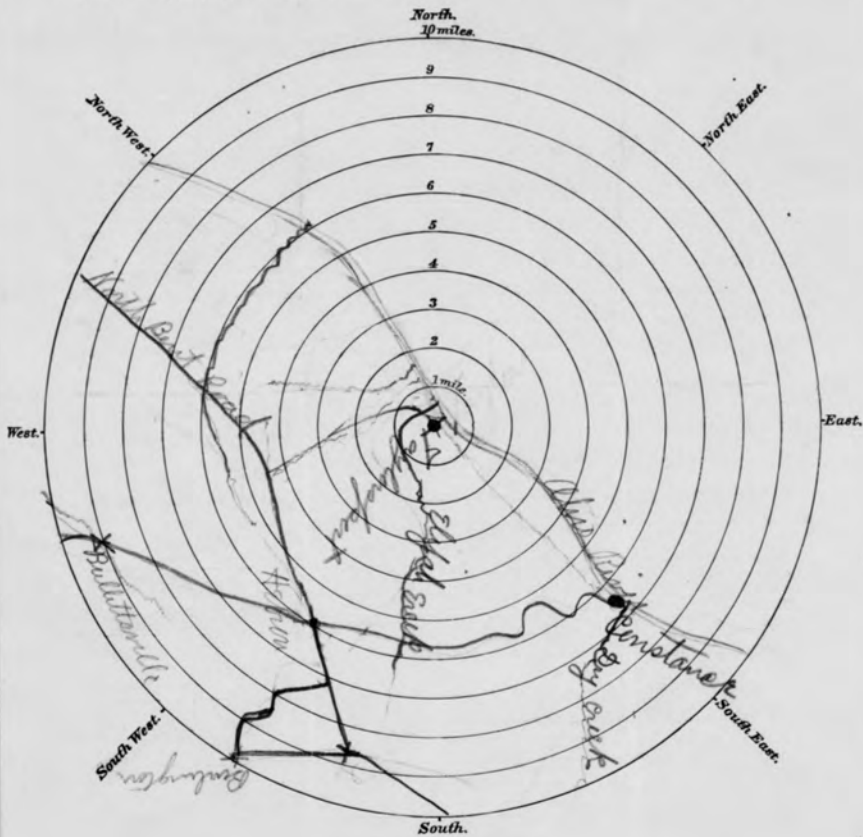

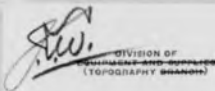
