The Erlanged Deposit Bank was incorporated on May 12, 1893, by W. H. Baker, W. A. Price, Daniel Bed-inger and Dr. W. H. Blanton. Captain W. H. Baker was the first president. We can think of no more befitting and sincere compliment to pay to his memory than to say that he was a real red-blooded American, a sagacious business man and a true friend.

The Erlanger Deposit Bank is one of the strongest country banks to be found anywhere. Erlanger's first fraternal order, was Good Fulth Lodge No. 95 of Free and Accepted Masons. It was opened hero on Doc. 18, 1892. This lodge was originally opened in Florence on April 8, 1834, and has had a continuous existence since that time. It was chartered before any of the Covington or other lodges in this section of the country. Its first meeting place in Erlanger was on the third floor of the Town Hail Building. After the erection of the Citizens Bank Building it was moved to the third floor of that building, where it is now located. Since its organization it has been an influence to good in the community


