For the conversion of sinners:

For the promotion of righteousness:

For the extension of the Kingdom of God; We dedicate this house.

In the bond of Christian brotherhood;

In charity and good will to all; We dedicate this house.

In gratitude for the labors of all who love and serve this church: In loving remembrance of those who have finished their course;

In the hope of a blessed immortality through Jesus Christ our Lord;

We dedicate this house.

Then shall the minister and people together say:
We now, the people of this church and congregation, compassed about with a great cloud of witnesses, grateful for our heritage, sensible of the sacrifice of our fathers in the faith, confessing that apart from us their work cannot be made perfect, do dedicate ourselves anew to the worship and service of Almighty God; through Jesus Christ our Lord. HISTORY OF EPWORTH METHODIST CHURCH

Eighty-nine years ago, a group of Protestant families joined together to make plans for a place of worship. A building lot was purchased on Main Street, West Covington. After many trials and tribulations the new Church was completed January 30th, 1879. Some of the original families withdrew because of denominational differences. Mrs. Charles Taylor, a Methodist, enlisted the aid of the Methodist Episcopal Church, and Union Protestant Church was placed on the Circuit with Ludlow. This secured pastors with regularity. On Sunday afternoon, April 6th. a meeting was held with Reverend W. W. Ramsey presiding. The total indebtedness of one thousand dollars was raised. Contributions were received from members, plus a generous donation from the builder, John Smith, and the total sum pledged was matched by a gift from Amos Shinkle. Thus, debt free, the Reverend W. W. Ramsey dedicated the Church with the Methodist Ritual for such an occasion. And so, Union Protestant became Union Methodist Church of West Covington. Upon annexation to Covington, a change in the church name was necessary because of Union Methodist Church in downtown Covington. Mrs. George Parsons, wife of the Pastor, suggested the name of Epworth, fittingly because of the Wesley Parsonage in Epworth, England.

Epworth celebrated its Golden Anniversary November 11, 1928. Reverend A. H. Davis arranged a full week of observance. Dr. John O. Gross, a former member and the first minister to come from this community church, was recalled as principal speaker. Mr. Eugene Clark, prepared a history of the church.

Pastors who have served Epworth are as follows: Reverends S. D. Akin, Fred Butts, Thomas Hanford, E. L. Shepherd, C. H. Williamson, L. B. Piersel, T. B. Stratton, W. H. Jones, W. A. Phillips, Rev. Gibson, Theodore Garrett, Amos Broering, J. H. Taulbee, J. H.

Litteral, D. Wendall Brown, I. G. Regan, Rev. Walters, Rev. Moore, Rev. Schell, Rev. Anthony, Rev. Vance, W. F. Felts, George A. Parsons, Rev. Mingeldorf, Rev. Scott, J. L. Albritton, A. H. "Daddy" Davis 1927-1942, James H. Talley 1942-1947, Wilford S. Mitchell 1947-1955, Cecil C. Tanner, 1955-1960, and the present pastor, Hugh E. Delaney, 1960 to the present.

The congregation had outgrown the old church, and Reverend Tallev put into motion the will for a new and better church. With the capable direction of Reverend W. S. Mitchell, the building plans were placed in the hands of the Building Committee: Elwood Turner. Chairman, W. S. Mitchell, Pastor; John Sowle, Sr., Merle Nelson, A. J. Luessen, Sr, William Hoffman, Ruth Bentz, and John Mitchell. The Architect was Charles Hildreth and the General Contractor was Shrude and Zimmerman. On August the second, 1953, the building was ready for occupancy. After a brief service in the old building at 1279 Parkway, the congregation marched to the new building and the first service was held. A full week of services followed.

In 1960 the church officials sold the old Parsonage at 1281 Parkway and bought a larger and better residence for the Pastor at 1310 Highway Avenue. This was paid for in full within a reasonable time. Bishop Walter Gum dedicated the Parsonage assisted by Reverend John Worthington.

Space and time do not allow us to record the names of all who, through the years, have served us so faithfully as officers, Church School Teachers, Sunday School Superintendents, and all the others who have labored here because they have been legion. We revere their memories and thank our Heavenly Father for them. May we go forward lifting high the gospel Torch they so faithfully carried, and may it inspire us to continue to bless and work in Christian service to this community.

OUR CHURCH RENDERS A MULTIPLE MINISTRY

VITAL SPIRITUAL LIFE is a matter of primary interest to the people of Epworth Methodist Church. A regular weekly Prayer Meeting and Bible Study and also a Prayer Group of the Twelve deepen the spiritual life of the participants. Much earnest praying is done for both the sick and the unsaved.

EVANGELISM is carried on the year round through preaching and evangelistic visitation. A revival is held each year.

CHRISTIAN EDUCATION in Sunday School is supplemented with an annual Vacation Bible School. There is also a week-day school of religion meeting in our building each week. The construction of additional Church School rooms is now being promoted.

IN MISSIONS the accepted amount on World Service and Conference Benevolences is paid each year. Missionary Advance Specials are carried in each of the Four Lanes: World missions, national missions, conference missions, and the Methodist Committee of Overseas Relief. Our world missionary Advance Special is \$168.00 given annually to support the work of Mr. and Mrs. Raymond Watson, missionaries from Ludlow, Kentucky. THE MUSIC of the Church is excellent. Under Jerry Tritsch's direction, the choir presents anthems each Sunday in an inspiring way. Mrs. A. J. Luessen, our

Organist, has rendered beautiful music in Epworth for years. The choir spends much time in preparing appropriate music for special occasions. The Easter and Christmas Cantatas are outstanding. SOCIAL CONCERNS receive due consideration in Epworth. The Christian stand on moral issues is expressed. The deserving destitute are helped. The bereaved and the seriously sick receive much attention.

FINANCIALLY, the Church has been on the Conference Honor Roll for several years by paying all of the preferred claims on time each Quarter. The people have paid for the building ahead of schedule. The annual Budget and Building Fund now total over \$15,000.00.

THROUGH ORGANIZATIONS our ministry to the people is multiplied. We have three Youth groups which meet weekly, two ladies' groups and a Methodist Men's Club which meet monthly. These groups accomplish a great deal. The men sponsor the boys in the YMCA Basketball League in the winter and in the Softball League in the summer. The ladies sponsor the girls in the YWCA Softball League in the summer. Both Boy Scouts and Cub Scouts meet in our Church.

EPWORTH is a church small enough to know you, yet strong enough to serve you.


