MAYSVILLE.

The county seat of Mason county, and the oldest place in the State. It is said to have been the landing place of Daniel Boone and Simon Kenton, and was first settled about one hundred years ago, when it was known as the "Point." It was next called Limestone, and in 1825 was incorporated as a city under its present name, in honor of Mr. May, who owned at one time, all the land on which the city now stands. It is situated on the Ohio river, 64 miles above Cincinnati, 90 from Catlettsburg, at the mouth of Big Sandy river, and 50 miles from Paris, with which place it is connected by the Maysville & Lexington R. R., the only line reaching the town. The surrounding country is very productive, and raises large quantities of tobacco and barley, also corn, wheat, and

hemp in smaller quantities. Live stock is raised to a considerable extent in the neighborhood, and forms an important item of shipment from here. Maysville is also the point of shipment for large quantities of the famous Blue Lick water, obtained at the springs, about 24 miles distant. The city has three weekly newspapers, three banks, and two hotels. Its principal manufactures are plows, castings, sash, doors, and blinds, wagons and carriages, cotton goods, and flour. It was once the location of an extensive coal oil refinery, which, however, has long since been discontinued. It is a place of comparatively slow growth. Its present population is about 6,000. For means of communication and transport, it depends in a great measure on the Ohio river steamboats, two of which pass each way daily. Telegraph, Western Union. Express, Adams. Daily mail. John M. 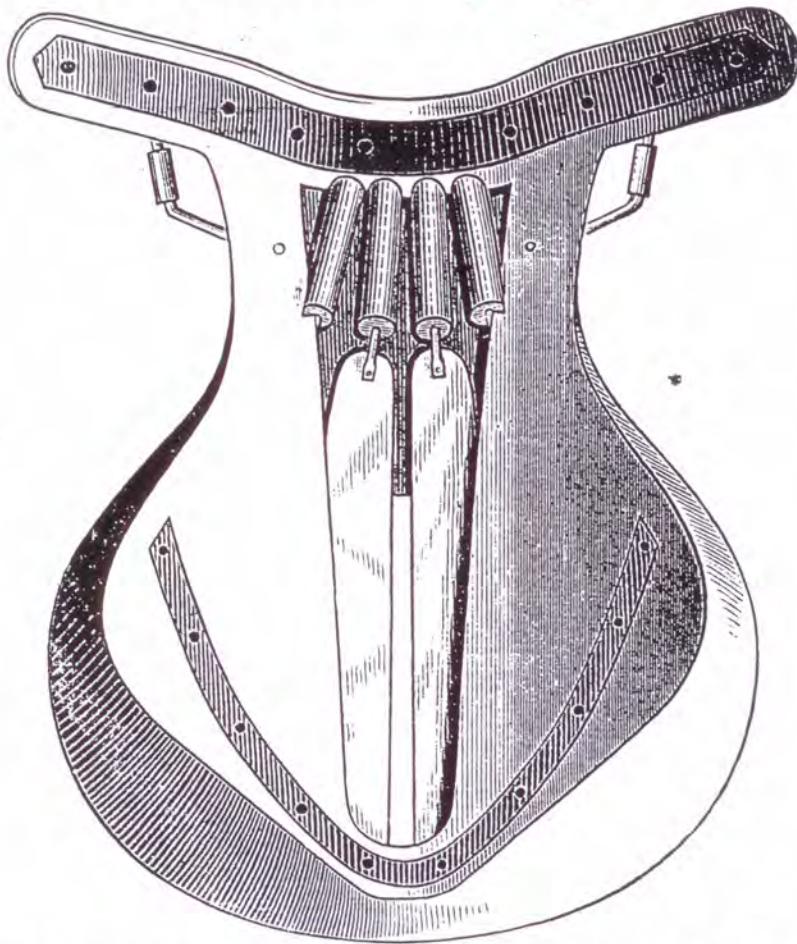
