

Northern Kentucky Views Presents:

MASON Maysville grows as tourists gateway between North and South; Milk Products Plant expands activities; tobacco market becomes center for Northeastern Kentucky growers; new warehouse is erected; concrete highway, State Route No. 10, is opened from Covington to Maysville; bridge across Ohio River at Maysville projected; button factory reopens; large chain mercantile establishment opens store at Maysville; Industrial Conference held at Maysville; 800 tons of agricultural lime used by Mason County farmers; 2,000 acres seeded to sweet clover; pure-bred cattle distributed; Dairy Herd Improvement Association is organized with 26 members; baby beeves raised in the county sold for \$11,500; 245 members enrolled in seven Junior Club organizations; county represented at District Junior Club Encampment.
