Mt. Sterling, fare 2.50, and 40 miles from Owensville, fare \$2.25.

Maysville was formerly called *Zimastone*, deriving its name from a creek so called, which enters the Ohio at this point. It was first settled in 1784 and among its first settlers was Col. Daniel Boone, who resided in this place in 1788. In 1788 the town was established, and subsequently called by its present name in honor of John May, a Virginia emigrant, and one of its early settlers, and former proprietor. Its frontier and exposed position retarded its progress until about 1815, when its steady and permanent improvement was fairly commenced. It was incorporated in 1835.

The situation is elevated and delightful. A range of bold and verdant highlands, rising immediately behind the city, render its appearance, as viewed from the river, exceedingly attractive. It is the entrepot of a large portion of the goods and produce imported and exported, by the north-eastern section of Kentucky, and is the most extensive hemp market in the United States.

In addition to the county buildings, it contains a handsome City Hall and hospital, seven churches, a flourishing seminary with an average attendance of 125 pupils, a female institute, two banks, (Branch of the Bank of Kentucky, capital \$450,000, A. M. January, president, J. Barbour, cashier, and Branch of the Farmers' Bank of Kentucky, capital \$300,000, Harrison Taylor, president, and Jas. A. Johnson, cashier,) numerous beneficial societies of various orders, several newspapers, (the *Maysville Eagle*, published weekly and tri-weekly, Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday by Thos. A. Curran, and the *Maysville Express*, issued on Friday, by Pickett & McKee.) It also contains about ninety stores of various kinds, two steam cotton factories, one large bagging factory, several iron foundries and plow manufactories, besides a large number of diversified mechanical trades. Population estimated at 5,000.
