

### 45. Description and House Plan:

The  $1\frac{1}{2}$ -story, 1-room plan, frame building has a 2-bay front (south) and rear (north), and an interior end chimney in the east gable. The upper half-story is lighted by a 6-pane casement window in the west gable, while the windows on the 1st floor have 6/6 lights. The building is sheathed with weatherboarding, and the foundation is covered with currogated metal. The sole exterior ornamentation is the decorative bargeboards. The front entry has a shed stoop roof and concrete steps, while the rear door has concrete steps only.

The interior features tongue-in-groove paneling and an enclosed corner staircase.


