His first wife, Susan Alexander, a daughter of Thomas Alexander, bore him three children, one of whom survives Ora. His present wife was formerly Miss Jessie Hunter, a daughter of David Hunter. This union has been blessed with three children, of whom one, Walter, is now living. Mr. Cox is held in respect by the people, and is a man of worth to the community." (Perrins)
