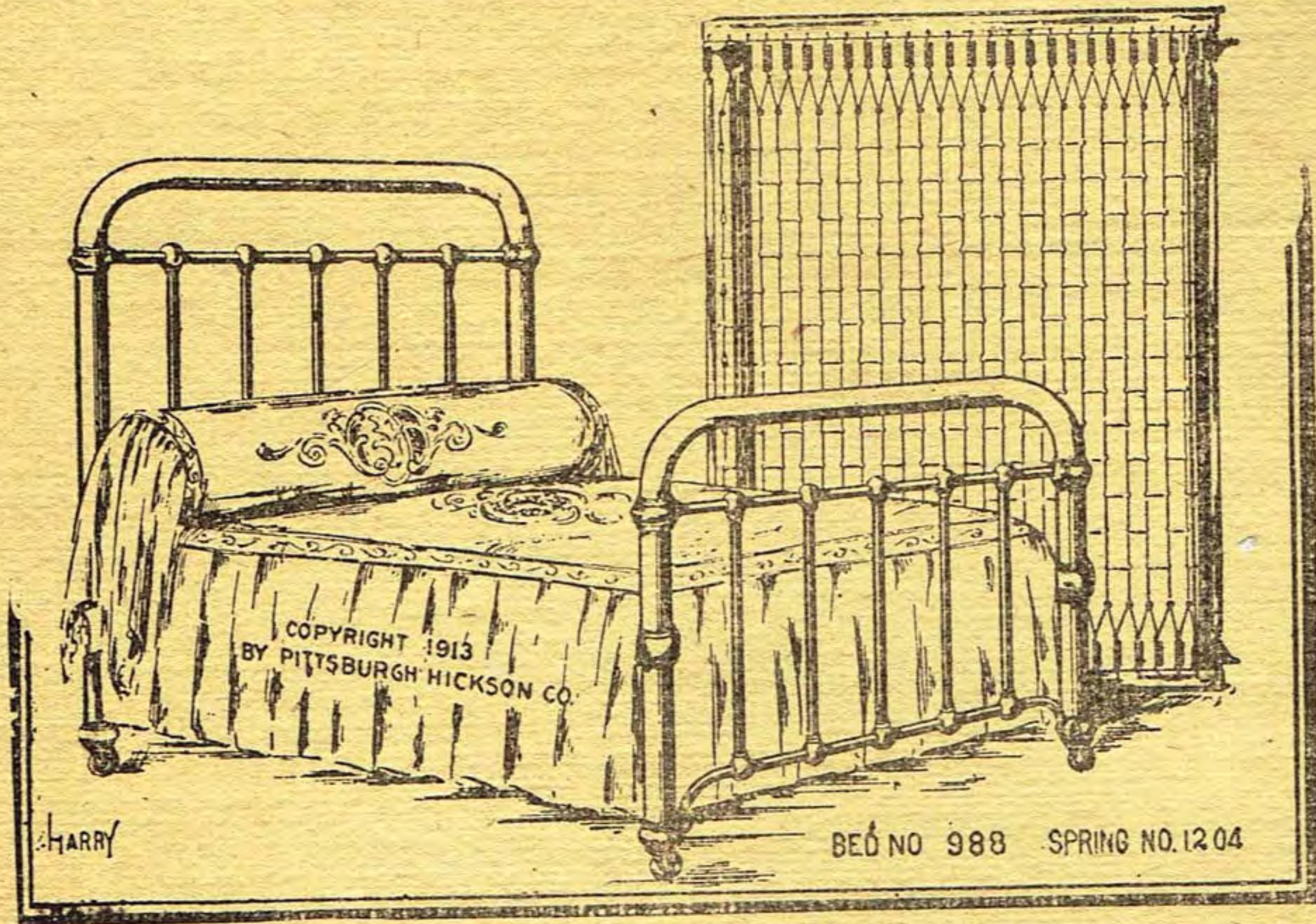

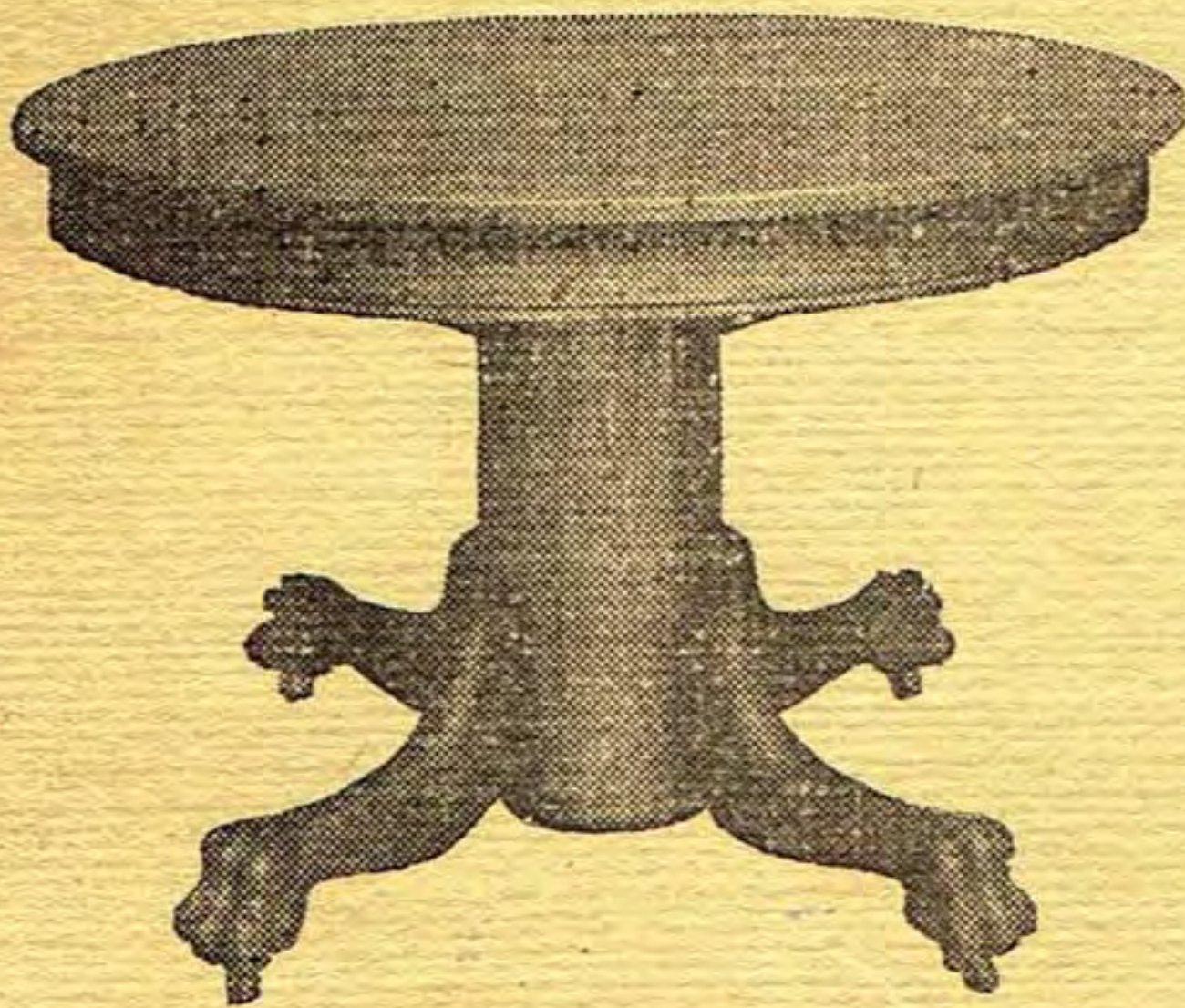

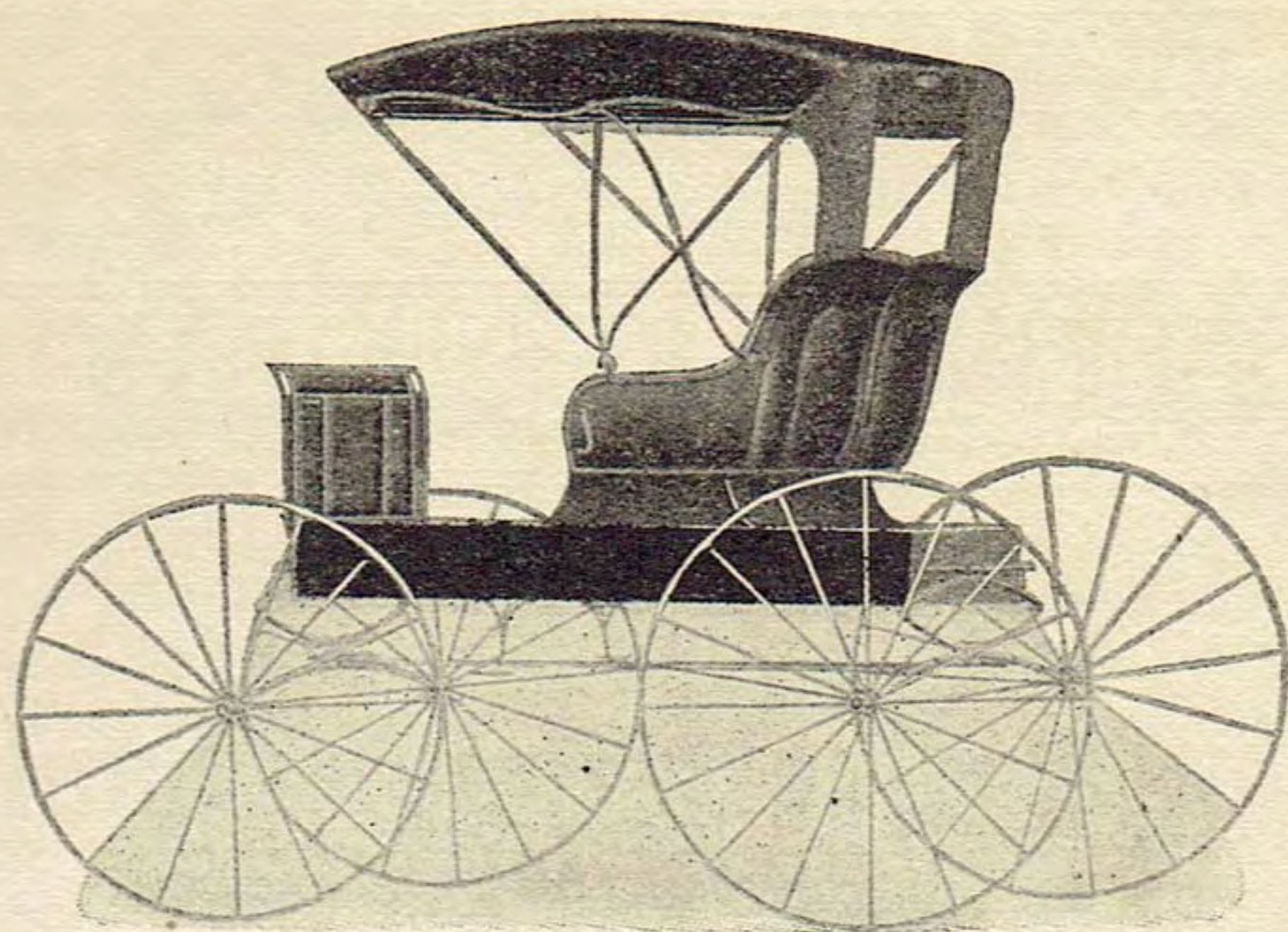

Rules and Regulations

1. Competition open to the world, unless otherwise specified.
2. All entries of stock must be made by 10 o'clock on day of exhibition. This rule will be strictly adhered to.
3. Each exhibitor will be furnished a card for each entry, and he must attach same to each article exhibited; placed on the bridle or halter of animals, or show same when demanded.
4. No person other than the officers of the Association and the judges shall be allowed to enter the ring where the stock and other articles are placed on exhibition.
5. Persons making known their ownership of stock or articles on exhibition to the judges will not be entitled to a premium.
6. The Association reserves the privilege of declaring off premiums or postponing the Fair on account of weather or other sufficient cause.
7. The name of exhibitors must not be displayed on articles competing for premiums.
8. Matched teams or roadsters may be shown, regardless of ownership.
9. The exhibition will commence each day at 9:30 a m. Entries may be made with Secretary ten days previous to the Fair at the Secretary's office in this city.
10. Gate to the ring will be closed ten minutes after the ringing of the bell.
11. Age of horses and mules shall be computed from the first day of January from which they are foaled.
12. No exhibitor will be permitted to enter the ring while his stock is being exhibited, except to ride, drive or lead the same.
13. No bull over one year old will be allowed on the grounds without a ring in his nose.
14. No animal with a contagious disease will be allowed in the ring or stables.
15. All stock and articles must be entered in the name of their owner, in their proper class.
16. The premiums are designated by ribbons, blue meaning first and red second.
17. The Secretary shall in no case let it be known how many or who have entered in rings for premiums.
18. All animals having taken a first premium shall be barred except in pairs, herds and sweepstakes.
19. No entrance fee in show rings, but all horses and mules must have stall tickets before entrance.
20. The officers of the Association will take every precaution in their power for the preservation of stock and other articles on exhibition, but will not be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur.

Rules and Regulations—Continued

21. All cash premiums will be paid at the Treasurer's office each day from 2 to 4 p. m., and positively at no other hour. Premiums awarded after 2 p. m. will not be paid until the following day between the hours above mentioned, except on the last day of the Fair, when premiums awarded after 2 p. m. will be eligible for payment in thirty minutes.

22. Stalls are numbered and will be assigned in regular rotation. Stalls are not engaged until paid for.

23. Stalls will be furnished at a uniform charge of 50 cents per day each. Bedding free.

24. No gasoline stove or fires will be permitted near or in any stable on the grounds nor in the booths.

25. Under no circumstances will any freight or express charges be paid by the Association.

26. No person will be admitted to the Fair Grounds without first procuring a ticket, which will be furnished at the office convenient to the entrance gate.

27. All premiums and other claims against the Association not paid by the Treasurer during the continuance of the Fair, will thereafter be paid by the Treasurer in Falmouth, if called for on or before December 1, 1913. All claims not called for before that date will be forfeited to the Association.

28. The sale of intoxicating liquors on or near the grounds will positively be prohibited.

29. No gaming or gambling devices will be allowed on or near the grounds.

30. An efficient police force will be on the grounds, and the public may feel assured that good order will be preserved.

31. Officers and directors are required to wear their badges during the Fair.

32. Gates to Fair Grounds will be open at 6 a. m.

33. Purchasers of privileges will be required to keep their spaces in a cleanly condition by removing any filth and litter and place it where the Fair Company's scavenger force may get it with ease.

34. The single-judge system will be used.

35. No one shall act as judge in any department if directly interested in any animal or article exhibited, or if nearly related to any exhibitor.

36. No premium shall be awarded when the exhibit is unworthy, though there be competition.

37. Should any doubt arise as to the regularity of an entry, or any other important matter, which the judge or awarding committee feels incompetent to decide, the same shall at once be reported to the directors of the department for decision, which, when made, shall be final.

38. Members of awarding committee shall not consult on the merits of animals they are judging, except so far as to point out unsoundness.

39. The judge or judges are requested to ride or drive any of the horses exhibited when, in their judgment, it will assist in making proper awards.

Rules and Regulations—Concluded

40. The Association will not be responsible for any article of any kind or nature that may be lost, damaged or destroyed. Each exhibitor shall be responsible for any injury that may be occasioned to any person whomsoever by any animal or article exhibited; and each exhibitor shall indemnify the Association against all claims or demands of any kind or nature that may grow out of any injury occasioned by any animal or article exhibited, or that shall arise from negligence of the person in charge of such exhibit.

ROADSTER HORSES.

When Mature Should Not Be Under Fifteen Hands.

41 To be judged by their speed, soundness, conformation, style, manners, mouth, hock and knee action, and when driven with ordinary or heavy shoes to force action, also whether strained with checking or severe bit. Records and pedigrees not to be considered. No weights, boots or hobbles allowed.

SADDLE HORSES.

42. To be judged by their soundness, conformation, manners, action, and unless otherwise specified, should show five distinct gaits as required by American Saddle Horse Breeders' Association, that is: First, walk; second, trot; third, rack; fourth, canter; fifth, running walk, fox trot or show pace.

HARNESS HORSES.

43. To be judged by their soundness, conformation quality, carriage manners and all-round action, and whether driven with ordinary or heavy shoes to force action, also whether strained with checking or severe bit. Excessive pace will not be required. No weights, boots or hobbles allowed. Light harness horses: Style, form and action to be considered.

Children under 6 years.....	Free

8. All persons entering articles will be furnished with a duplicate or property check. Goods will be surrendered only on the presentation of this check to the Superintendent having charge of said goods.
9. All premiums will be awarded first day.
10. All premiums paid in cash, unless otherwise stated.
11. All articles which are the product of the soil must be entered in the name of the producer of the same, and no person shall exhibit fruits, flowers and other products of the soil other than his own raising.
12. No smoking allowed in the Hall.
13. The ownership of articles in the Hall shall be withheld from the judges. No person, except the judges and officers, will be allowed to remain in the Hall while the judges are awarding the premiums.
