My Office is situated in North part of Grant Township, or in — quarter of Tract No. —

State of Kentucky Township, County of Grant

The name of the most prominent river near it is Ohio River

My Office is 1.8 miles from said river, on the S-E side of it, and is 2 miles from said nearest creek, on the N-E side of it.

My Office is at a distance of 266 feet from the track of the C.N.O. & T.R.R. Railroad, on the West side of the railroad.

My Office is 4 miles, air-line distance, from nearest point of my County boundary.

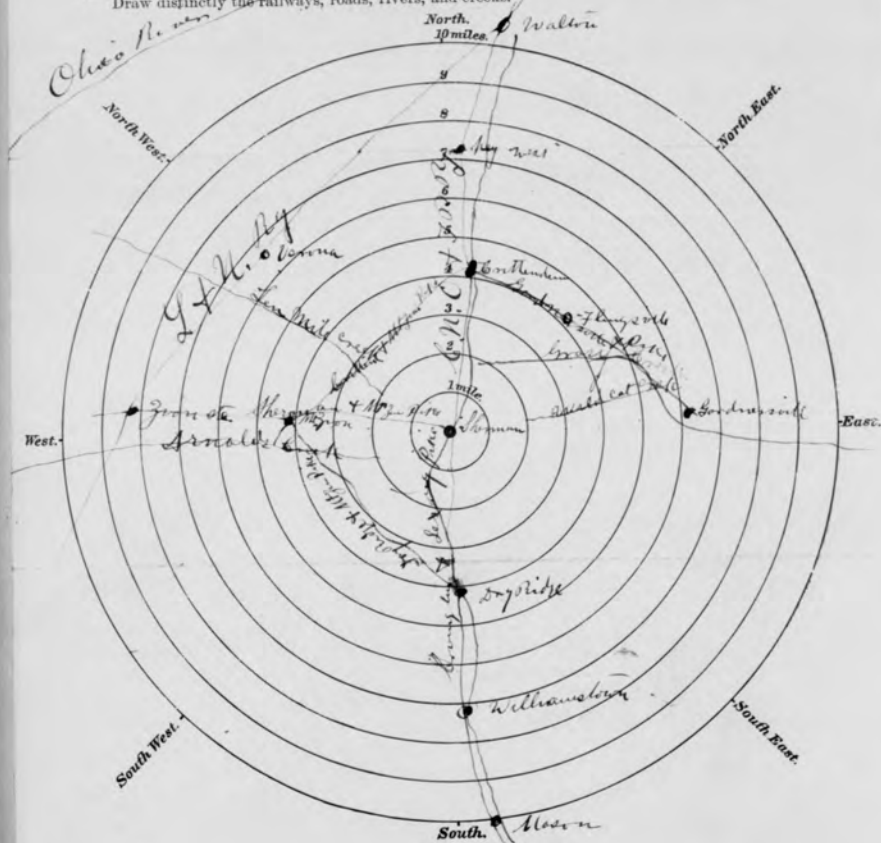
DIAGRAM, EXPLANATION, AND INSTRUCTIONS.

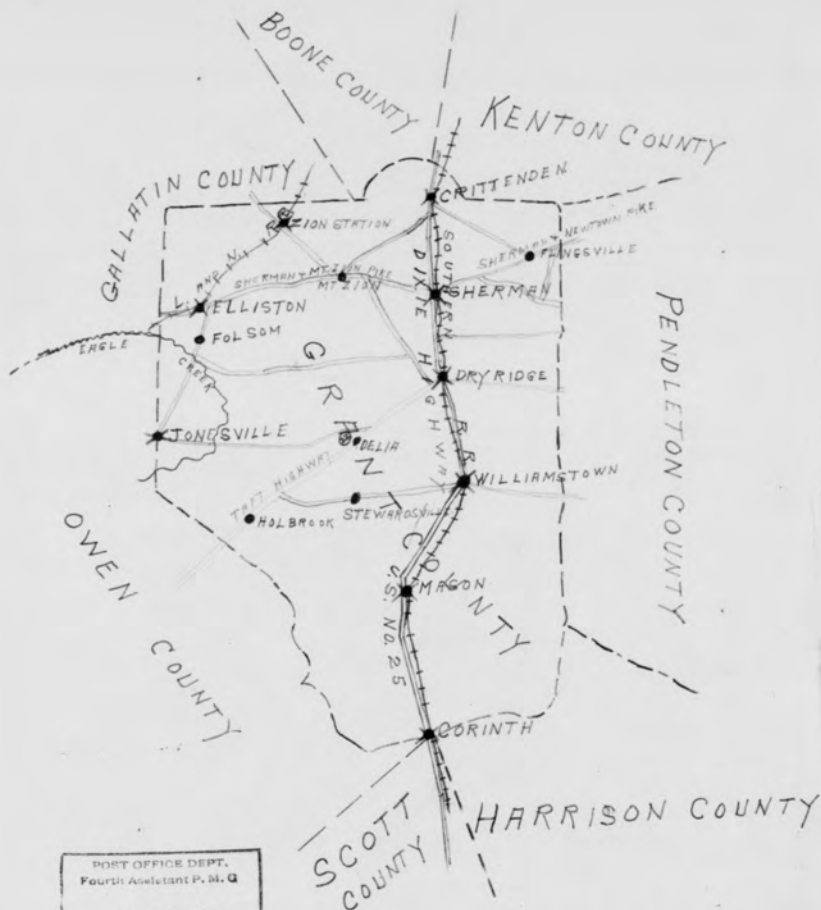
